

Recognizing Signs of Sudden Cardiac Death

Warning Signs:

Common warning signs a person may be at risk for sudden cardiac death:

- Fainting (especially during exercise)
- Fainting suddenly with loud noises alarm clock, phone ringing, or doorbell warrants investigation.
 - Chest pain or shortness of breath with activity
 - Racing heartbeat or palpitations
 - Unexplained seizures
 - Family history of sudden death under age 50

Symptoms:

When sudden cardiac arrest occurs, it may look like:

- Sudden loss of consciousness
 - No pulse
 - No breathing
 - Unresponsiveness

This is a **medical emergency** – immediate CPR and defibrillation (AED use) can be lifesaving.

Take Action!

Early and quick action makes all the difference!

- Learn CPR and AED use classes are free or low-cost.
 - Encourage your child to speak up about symptoms.
- AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators) are simple and lifesaving.
 - Parents and students can ask about school emergency plans.
